²⁶Then Jesus and his disciples arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, “What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me”—²⁹for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) ³⁰Jesus then asked him, “What is your name?” He said, “Legion”; for many demons had entered him. ³¹They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

³²Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

³⁴When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country.

³⁵Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. ³⁷Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. ³⁸The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹"Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.

Daughter of Grace to converse about new book, *Joyful Defiance: Death Does Not Win the Day*.

Anna Madsen attended Grace, (confirmed in 1984) when her father, George Madsen, was a pastor here. She is now a theologian who lives in Minnesota's north woods and has written a book processing the tragic death of her husband and the trauma that followed. The publisher says:

"The challenge is to acknowledge death in its manifold forms and own one's indignation and grief, and yet transcend it so that even if we are angry, we do not become anger. This book names the tension between grief and hope, acknowledges the reality of both, and defines a path forward to a life of joyful defiance. That path runs through Holy Saturday, a day that has one foot in the fear, grief, and death of Good Friday while the other is in Easter, a day of hope, freedom, life, and joy."

All women are invited to discuss the studies found in the Gather magazines for May/June and July/August with Pastor Becca Holland.



Dreaming

Yesterday while visiting a member in her apartment, she gave me one of those Dove chocolates that have messages inside the wrapper. Mine said:

“Don’t do all your dreaming when you are asleep!”

That is a good way to describe what we are doing in our process with Pastor Erin Nelson to have a clearer sense of how we serve God in this time and place.

At the heart of the process is listening and being attentive to those around us and what God may have to say through them. The eighteen of us present were given some options for homework to gather some of the direction we need for the next session:

We agreed to do Dwelling in the Word on Exodus 16 in the June 26th worship service, with the crafters, and I believe with the council. We listen to the passage with our spirits open to hear:

1. what words God pushes in our direction that really stand out for us
2. what new questions stir in us as we listen and
3. is there any direction that each of us hears from God for the process we are engaging in.

We also have questions with different kinds of people:

- Members of the congregation about when God has been especially present to them in their life and what the church had to do with that.
- Non-church going folks about where they see God moving in their life.
- Leaders in the community about the needs that they see in our area and the gifts people have which are in search of a place to use them.

Finally, we were invited to walk our neighborhood with another member and pay attention to what you notice and what that says about the place where Grace is located.

If you are interested in doing any of these tasks, Pastor Phil will coach you and give you a hand out. If you would like to hear what others have discovered, the next meeting is Wednesday, July 6th at 6pm in the Parlours.

I am excited about dreaming together about what Jesus is calling us to do in this time. The energy feels good and the more participating the merrier we will be!
